recycled fashion show. Always a sellout, we delighted more than 350 guests and hit a new record for funds raised! We are gratified and overjoyed by this generous show of support, and are especially pleased that more than \$90,000 of our proceeds were paid directly to local and supporting artists through commissions and wages.

Advancing Our Mission: Working with Students at Napa County Court & Community Schools

Nimbus Arts and Napa County Court & Community Schools significantly expanded our art education and mentoring program this academic year! With more than 150 students participating throughout the 2016-17 academic year, and 50 students during the Spring 2017 session alone, our program augments the educational needs of students who are under the protection or authority of the juvenile court system. Working with and learning from Nimbus Art instructors, students are introduced to art as a tool for self-expression and self-determination.

The program's Director Caroline Wilson, says, *"...our students tell us being at Nimbus makes them feel capable, empowered, and creative, and that art activates a richer sense of purpose and meaning."*



This spring the program also expanded to include weekly art classes at the Napa County Juvenile Hall. The impact of the program has been incredibly rewarding to all involved and has

helped meet the Nimbus Art mission to bring art into areas of our community that can be elevated and empowered by creativity.

A final note, Nimbus Arts' teacher and artist David Massaro was tapped as this year's commencement speaker for the graduation ceremony of students

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in the Court and Community Schools. Many of the graduates were also participants in the Nimbus Arts program in St. Helena and learned metalworking and welding from David.

'Hundreds of Hands' Our 4th public art installation comes to life this fall!

Community art is central to Nimbus Arts' mission; our current "Hundreds of Hands" community art initiative is transforming a prominent but underused part of the grounds of St. Helena Elementary School into the "Creativity Corner!" Located at the corner of Adams and Oak Street, the "Creativity Corner" will serve as an art education and activity space for students and the community.

Over 150 volunteers participated in our free mosaic workshops over the last 6 months and fabricated a meandering dragon mosaic that will be featured in



the central design element, a massive bench and table. The dragon motif celebrates

St. Helena Elementary School's mascot and the multicultural mythology of dragons.
