Nim+BUS: ETA 2021!



At Nimbus Arts, we have long dreamed of having a van or bus, fully stocked with art supplies and equipment so that it is at-the-ready to deliver art education and activities to community schools, events and private parties. The pandemic and recurring wildfires in our region have demonstrated the need for us to improve our capacity to deliver art activities beyond the walls of our three studios, and so the Nim+BUS will soon be moving from dream to reality.

Long-term Nimbus teaching artist and Board member David Garden recently designed a prototype of our Nim+BUS "studio-on-wheels". When completed, Nim+BUS will deliver a wide variety of art activities and formats, including painting and drawing, pottery and sculpture, mosaic, and a range of mixed media arts and crafts. It will also carry movable and adjustable single workstations that can serve students from toddlers to seniors, at whatever distance is required or appropriate.

Nim+BUS will enable us to bring hands-on art activities and artist-led programs directly to all communities we serve across Napa Valley and provide the proven social, emotional and therapeutic benefits of art, especially at times of great need.

Our Hundreds of Hands program generates these benefits by getting as many people involved with hands-on art as possible, each time with the goal of creating a large-scale community-made public art installation. Over the years, our projects have increased in scope and scale, literally involving many hundreds of hands, and this year our projects needed to be modified for social distancing and the impact of the fires. But our vision for Hundreds of Hands continues uninterrupted—to bring diverse groups of people together to learn, connect and create meaningful art installations that bring joy, beauty and strength to our community.

To keep art education and activities available to people throughout Napa Valley, Nimbus Arts provided more than 500 free "Art Kits To-Go" through the Boys and Girls Club of St. Helena and Calistoga, St. Helena Preschool for All, The UpValley Family Center, Hunt's Grove, and Napa County Court & Community Schools, all through the generous support of Nimbus Arts, Arts Council Napa Valley, and many other donors. We are also deeply thankful to the community at large for their support, participation and enjoyment of the moving

and beautiful Día de los Muertos mask installation.

We also offer a large variety of Art Kits To-Go for sale on our website, under the "Shop" tab. Nimbus Art Kits To-Go support continued art engagement with families, adults and seniors, and are sometimes offered with coordinated online programming. While originally designed for use while our studio use is restricted or limited, our Art Kits are so popular that we will be expanding our "To-Go" offerings in 2021 and beyond.
