We've long dreamed of taking Nimbus Arts on the road — by creating a mobile studio fully stocked with art supplies and equipment so that it is at-the-



ready to deliver art education and activities to community schools, events and private parties. Recent events, including social distancing restrictions and wildfires, demonstrated the need for us to deliver art activities beyond the walls of our three studios. To meet this need, our Nim+BUS will soon be moving from dream to reality. Long-term Nimbus teaching artist and Board member David Garden designed a prototype of our Nim+BUS "studio-on-wheels" that we're working hard to activate. When completed, the Nim+BUS will deliver a wide variety of art activities and formats, including painting and drawing, (CONTINUED)

Nim+BUS (CONTINUED): pottery and sculpture, mosaic, and a range of mixed media arts and crafts. It will also carry movable and adjustable single workstations that can serve students from toddlers to seniors, at whatever distance is required. We need your support to get this bus movin'! Nimbus Artist Profile: Margaret Dennett



Margaret Dennett taught high school Art and Drama for 20 plus years in the Napa Valley, and created the Art and Drama programs at New Tech High. After she retired from NVUSD in 2017, Margaret found herself sorely missing her daily contact with teens, so she volunteered to work with Court and Community (C+C) students at Nimbus. After a few months

of volunteering, Margaret took over ceramic instruction for our C+C program, and she's become a passionate teacher of both C+C programs and Nimbus studio classes. Margaret says, "This is a dream come true for me as I love ceramics and love working with teens. Sitting and creating with these teens can be both tough and magical; it's such a pleasure to watch them explore clay. Nimbus is giving them a safe place to test and challenge themselves, connect to working artists, and learn process and patience through wheel throwing and hand-building ceramics."

Margaret has also been inspired through teaching to delve more into her own art practices, including painting, printmaking and ceramics. Her art is ever-evolving, and her love of nature and place are major personal themes she continues to explore.

"The joy I get from art keeps me wanting to learn more. I have felt welcome at Nimbus from day one when I first volunteered. I hope to continue working with teens and also with the many children and adults who come to Nimbus, eager to create."

Our Día de los Muertos Community Celebration



Due to COVID restrictions, our annual Día de los Muertos Community Celebration, co-produced with the UpValley Family Centers, transitioned to a remote community art event. Nimbus Arts created and distributed more than 250 free art-kits-to-go to the community and created a large-scale art installation featuring the work of dozens of community members and artists. The installation, sited at the corner of Main and Spring Streets in St. Helena, used the traditional

Día de los Muertos motif of masks to celebrate Mexican-American heritage and the life and memory of our family members. The Día de los Muertos activities were made possible by the sponsorship of the Walker Building Company, the John J. Griswold Foundation, the Damian Maldonado Memorial Foundation, and the Napa Valley Vintners.



Our Hundreds of Hands™ #008 - "Taking Liberties" Community Art Mobile Installation

Nimbus Arts began 2021 with "Taking Liberties"—a Mobile Mural displayed in St. Helena from Jan 19th - February 8th. Individual community artists each created their own interpretation of the Statue of Liberty, using their artistic voice to convey their hopes and aspirations, frustrations and fears, as we moved into the new year and inaugurated a new President. These individual artworks were then assembled into our community art installation.

Reflecting on the past year, many of our liberties have been restricted and we all miss time with friends and exploring and enjoying new experiences. Despite these restrictions to our liberties, **Our Lady Liberty Stands Tall!** and our community art mural will honor this symbol of our Democracy. More community art programs to engage and connect our community will continue through the year, thanks to the community support from people like you. The mural project was made possible through funding from the Napa Valley Vintners and Walker Building Company. Also, a special thanks to Laura Rombauer and Vintage Home for the use of their wonderful display space.
